

Accessibility statement for Moulsoe Parish Council

This website is run by Moulsoe Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means that you will be able to:

- change contrast levels
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the site using just a keyboard
- listen to most of the website using the screen reader

We have also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

Technical information about the accessibility of this website

Moulsoe Parish Council is committed to making its website accessible, in accordance with Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Compliance status

This website is **partially compliant** with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.1 AA standard.

How we tested this site

This website was tested in August 2020 using online testing software. Our approach was to test the main textual pages for use with the adaptive and assistive technology readily available on a normal PC.

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons:

- Images – some images do not yet have text alternative (alt text), therefore the information in them is not available to people using a screen reader.
- Issues with PDF and other documents – some of the PDF and Word documents do not meet accessibility standards. For example, they may not be structured to be accessible to a screen reader.

Exemptions from the accessibility guidelines

The following areas are excluded under section 4 (2) of the guidelines:

- PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018
- maps
- third party content for example, social media 'like' buttons
- archived websites

The Parish Council hope to continue to improve accessibility to the website. Any feedback on areas where further improvements are required would be welcomed.
